REMINDER: CLOSING DATES FOR RENEWAL OF PERMISSION TO REMAIN IN THE STATE GRANTED UNDER THE IBC/05 SCHEME.

THIS NOTICE IS ISSUED FURTHER TO PREVIOUS NOTICES OF JANUARY AND JULY 2007

1. This notice refers to applications for renewal of permission to remain in the State from persons who were originally granted permission under the Irish Born Child Scheme 2005 (IBC/05).
2. Persons granted under the Scheme are reminded that the following closing dates will apply for receipt of renewal applications:
 - **Persons granted permission to remain in the State in the period 15 January 2005 to 31 March 2006 under the IBC/05 Scheme, who wish to renew, must apply for renewal by Monday 31 March 2008.**
 - **Persons granted permission to remain in the State as of 1 April 2006 under the IBC/05 Scheme, who wish to renew, must apply to the IBC Unit/Department one month in advance of the date on which their permission to remain in the State expires.**
3. Applications for renewal must be made on the IBC Renewal application form. This form and the accompanying information leaflet are available on our website at www.inis.gov.ie. Hard copies of the form and leaflet are available at the Irish Naturalisation and Immigration Service (INIS), 13-14 Burgh Quay, Dublin 2 and Garda District Headquarters stations outside Dublin. Forms are also distributed to various non-governmental organisations working with immigrants and asylum seekers. Blank forms can be photocopied and applications submitted on photocopied forms.
4. Applicants are advised to read the information leaflet which accompanies the IBC Renewal application form before completing their application. Each parent who wishes to apply for renewal of permission to remain in the State must complete a separate application form. Application forms which are not completed in full and accompanied by the necessary supporting documentation will not be processed and may be returned.

PLEASE NOTE: if your permission to remain in the State expires and you do not renew it, your presence in the State may become illegal unless you have an alternative legal basis for remaining.

This notice is published for information purposes, and does not state comprehensively all of the relevant terms that apply. Each applicant is strongly advised to read carefully the information leaflet and the application form itself where the terms of the Scheme are set out
